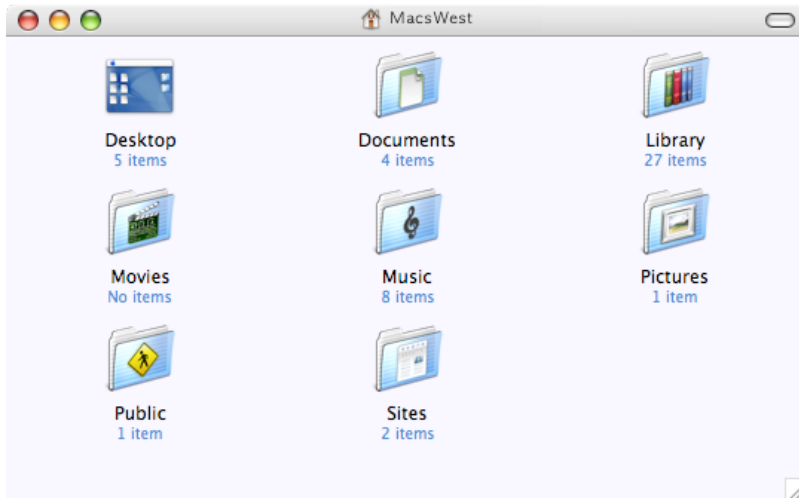


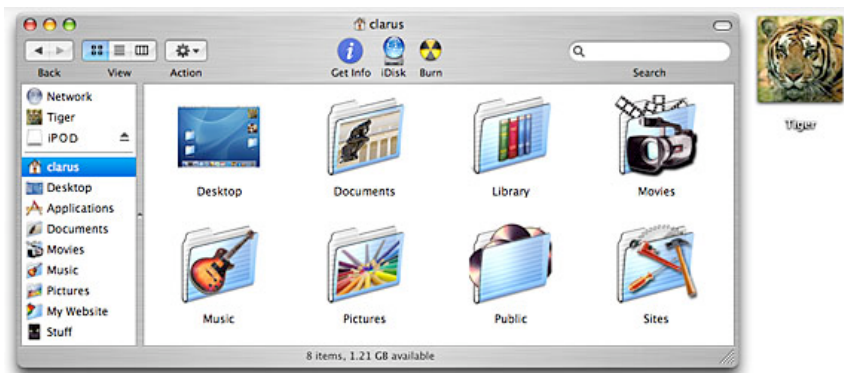
Changing the Mac's Icons



Every volume, application, file, and folder on your Mac is represented by an icon.



Hard disk looks like a hard drive, CDs and DVDs look like discs, and removable drives look like removable drives).



Customized examples a "Home folder's" folders.

To change an item's icon to another one:

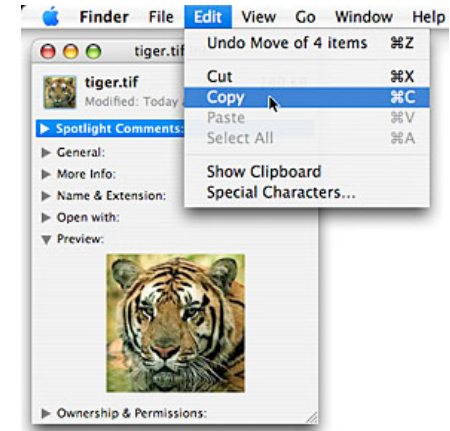
Select the volume, application, folder, or file whose icon you want to stamp onto another (just click the icon to select it).

From the **File** menu, choose **Get Info** (or press Command-I) to open the Info window.

Click the icon in the upper-left corner of the Info window to select it.

From the **Edit** menu, choose **Copy** (or press Command-C).

The new icon is now in the computer's clipboard

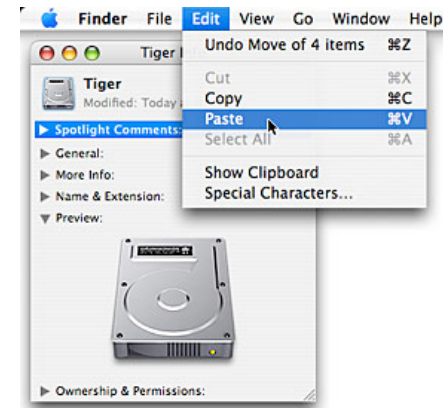


Select the volume, application, folder, or file whose icon you want to replace.

From the **File** menu, choose **Get Info** (or press Command-I).

Click the icon in the upper-left corner.

From the **Edit** menu, choose **Paste** (or press Command-V) to replace the icon.



Now the drive “Looks like a Tiger.”



Your own photo file icons, such as those from a TIFF or JPEG image are great sources to use if you want totally unique icons.
